Significance of this day:

Worship method and traditions of Vishwakarma Day:

- 1. Cleaning and decoration of the place: The workplace, factory, or the place where machines and tools are kept is cleaned. It is decorated with flowers, lamps and rangoli.
- 2. Installation of the idol of Lord Vishwakarma: An idol or picture of Lord Vishwakarma is installed at the place of worship. This place is decorated with flowers and lamps.
- 3. Worship of tools and machines: On this day, tools, machines, and vehicles are worshipped by applying tilak on them. This is seen as a blessing that ensures efficiency and safety in work.
- Chanting of Mantras and Havan: The mantras of Lord Vishwakarma are chanted and a Havan is performed to seek happiness, prosperity and success of the work.
- 5. Aarti and Prasad distribution: At the end of the puja, Aarti is performed and Prasad is distributed. All the family members and staff take the Prasad.
- 6. A day off from work: On this day machines and tools are given rest and not used, this is seen as a show of respect for the equipment.
