- 7- **Virupaksha** – The one with strange eyes (Shiva has three eyes)
- 8- **Kapardi** – The one who wears matted hair
- 9- **Neellohit** – The one with blue and red colour
- 10- **Shankar** – The one who does good to everyone
- 11- **Shoolpani** – The one who holds a trident in his hand
- 12- **Khatvangi** – The one who holds one leg of the cot



- 13- Vishnuvallabh** – The most beloved of Lord Vishnu
- 14- Shipivishta** – The one who enters the Situha
- 15- Ambikanath** – The husband of Goddess Bhagwati
