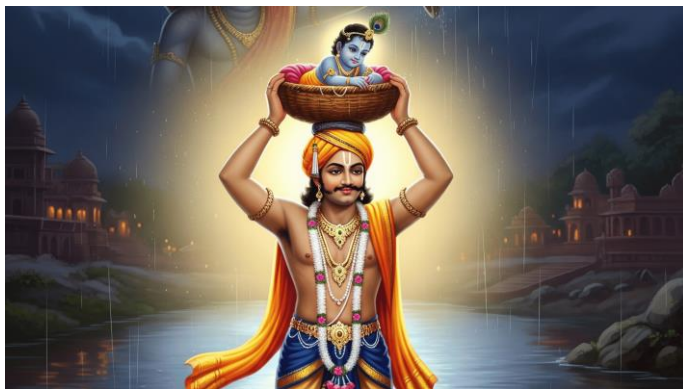




Ancient Vedic Mantras and Rituals

In Hinduism, the **Dwadashi Tithi (12th lunar day)** holds a special religious significance. Every month, both the Shukla and Krishna Paksha have their respective Dwadashi dates, and some of these are dedicated to various forms of Lord Vishnu. Significance of Vasudev Dwadashi

What is Done on Vasudev Dwadashi?

1. Fasting and Vow (Vrat)

Devotees observe **fasts (either waterless or with fruits)** on this day. Some consume only one meal and spend the day meditating on Lord Krishna and Vasudev Ji.

2. Worship of Vasudev Ji

Since there are very few temples dedicated solely to Vasudev Ji, **special prayers are offered in Vishnu or Krishna temples**, remembering Vasudev Ji during the rituals.

3. Scriptural Recitation and Stories

Devotees read and listen to **stories of Krishna's birth, Vasudev and Devaki's life**, and their struggles. It strengthens faith and the resolve to follow the path of dharma.

4. Charity and Virtuous Acts

Donating on this day is considered highly auspicious. Items such as food, clothes, utensils, umbrellas, and alms are given. Some also perform **Pind Daan or Tarpan** for their ancestors.

5. Special Celebrations in Temples

Temples in **Mathura, Vrindavan**, and other places hold **special prayers, kirtans, devotional gatherings**, and **Jhulan (swing) festivals**.

Vasudev Dwadashi Vrat Vidhi (Worship Rituals)

- Bathe early and wear clean clothes.
- Place an image or symbol of Vasudev Ji in front of you.
- Offer lamp, incense, flowers, tilak, naivedya, and water.
- Chant Lord Vishnu's mantras and recite "**Om Vasudevaya Namah**".
- Feed a Brahmin and donate as per your capacity.



Mythological Story Behind Vasudev Dwadashi

According to legend, when Kansa imprisoned **Devaki and Vasudev**, he killed their first seven sons. When **Lord Krishna was born as their eighth son**, an **oracle (divine voice)** instructed Vasudev to carry the baby across the **Yamuna River to Gokul**. It was a dangerous mission at night during a storm, but Vasudev Ji fulfilled his duty and **safeguarded Krishna**.

It is believed that **Lord Vishnu himself orchestrated this task through Vasudev Ji** to ensure the future re-establishment of dharma. To honor this **selfless act of duty and devotion**, Vasudev Dwadashi is observed.

In today's era, where **family bonds are weakening**, Vasudev Dwadashi reminds us of the **vital role of a father**. The youth should take inspiration from Vasudev Ji's character—who made sacrifices for his family, upheld righteousness, and served society.
