- **Learning from the Past** – No matter how one's past has been, with effort and determination, one can change the course of life.

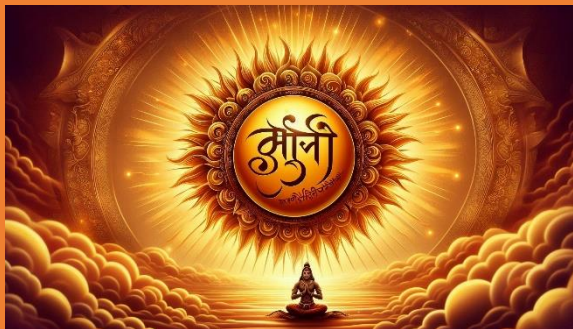

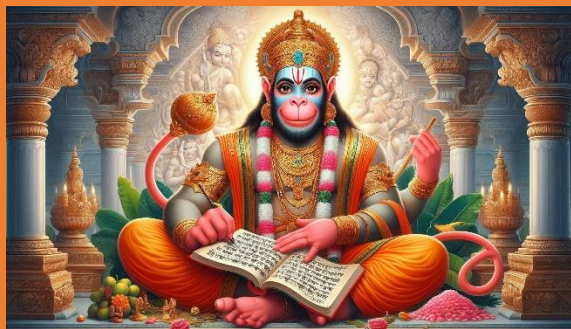
