Hariyali Amavasya 2026

Hariyali Amavasya is one of the most sacred and auspicious festivals in Hinduism, observed on the **Amavasya (New Moon) of the Shravan (Sawan) month**. This day is dedicated to the worship of **Lord Shiva, Goddess Parvati, ancestors (Pitru Devtas), and nature**. Since the monsoon season covers the earth with lush greenery, this Amavasya is known as **Hariyali Amavasya**.

In **2026, Hariyali Amavasya will be observed on Wednesday, 12 August 2026**. Taking a holy bath, offering donations, performing Pitru Tarpan, worshipping Lord Shiva, and planting trees are considered highly auspicious on this day. Many regions also organize fairs, religious events, and tree plantation drives to celebrate the occasion.

Importance of Hariyali Amavasya

Hariyali Amavasya holds immense spiritual and environmental significance.



The holy month of Shravan is dedicated to Lord Shiva, and the Amavasya falling during this period is believed to purify the mind, body, and soul.

Observing this sacred day is believed to bring the following blessings:

- Blessings of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati.
- Grace and satisfaction of ancestors (Pitru Devtas).
- Increased spiritual merit through charity and good deeds.
- Happiness, peace, and prosperity in life.
- Removal of negative energies.
- Inspiration to protect and preserve nature.

According to Hindu beliefs, taking a holy dip in a sacred river, performing Pitru Tarpan, and offering charity on Hariyali Amavasya bring immense spiritual benefits.

Hariyali Amavasya Puja Vidhi (Rituals)

Wake up early in the morning, take a holy bath, and wear clean clothes before beginning the worship.

Follow these steps:

1. Light a sacred lamp (Diya) in your home temple.
2. Offer water, milk, and Bilva (Bel) leaves to Lord Shiva.



3. Chant the sacred mantra **“Om Namah Shivaya.”**
4. Perform Pitru Tarpan for your ancestors.
5. Worship the Peepal tree, Banyan tree, or other sacred trees.
6. Donate food, clothes, and money to the needy.
7. Plant a tree and pledge to care for it.

What to Donate on Hariyali Amavasya?

The following donations are considered highly auspicious:

- Food grains
- Clothes
- Umbrella
- Water pot
- Fruits
- Cow service (Gau Seva)
- Saplings
- Monetary donation

It is believed that charity performed on this day helps reduce Pitru Dosha and attracts prosperity and happiness.



Hariyali Amavasya and Tree Plantation

Hariyali Amavasya is also celebrated as a festival dedicated to environmental conservation.

Planting the following trees and plants is considered especially auspicious:

- Peepal Tree
- Banyan Tree
- Neem Tree
- Indian Gooseberry (Amla)
- Bel Tree
- Tulsi (Holy Basil)

Many states across India organize large-scale tree plantation campaigns on this occasion.

Auspicious Remedies on Hariyali Amavasya

For peace, prosperity, and spiritual growth, devotees can perform the following remedies:

- Offer water and milk to the Shivling.
- Pour water on the Peepal tree.
- Feed green fodder to cows.



- Offer food to the poor and needy.
- Recite the Shiva Chalisa and Maha Mrityunjaya Mantra.
- Plant a Tulsi or Bel tree at home.

Mythological Significance of Hariyali Amavasya

According to Hindu scriptures, the month of Shravan is especially dear to Lord Shiva. Worshipping Lord Shiva, performing Pitru Tarpan, and honoring nature on Hariyali Amavasya are believed to remove sins accumulated over many lifetimes.

Trees are regarded as divine manifestations in Hindu tradition; therefore, planting and nurturing trees on this day is considered an act of great virtue.

- **Amavasya Tithi Begins:** Approximately 01:52 AM
- **Amavasya Tithi Ends:** Approximately 11:06 PM

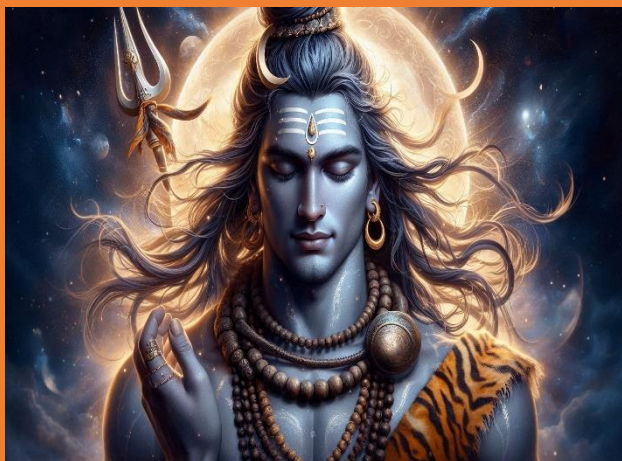
Which Deities Are Worshipped on Hariyali Amavasya?
