Krishna Janmashtami 2026: जानें तारीख, शुभ मुहूर्त, महत्व और कैसे मनाएं जन्माष्टमी | PDF

Shri Krishna Janmashtami 2026 is one of the major festivals of Hinduism. This festival is celebrated as the **birth anniversary of Lord Shri Krishna**, the eighth incarnation of Lord Vishnu. Every year, Janmashtami is celebrated on the Ashtami Tithi of Krishna Paksha in the month of Bhadrapada. On this day, devotees worship Lord Shri Krishna, observe fasts, sing devotional songs and bhajans, and celebrate his birth at midnight.

When is Shri Krishna Janmashtami 2026?

Shri Krishna Janmashtami 2026 will be celebrated on Friday, September 4, 2026. According to the Panchang, the Ashtami Tithi will begin at around 2:25 AM on September 4, 2026, and end at approximately 12:13 AM on September 5.

Lord Shri Krishna is believed to have been born at midnight, which is why Janmashtami puja and the birth celebration are performed at night. The Nishita Puja timings may vary slightly depending on the location. For example, in Delhi, the Nishita Puja time is approximately **11:57 PM to 12:43 AM**.



Note: The date of Janmashtami may vary slightly according to different regions and Vaishnava traditions. Devotees should follow their local Panchang or the tradition of their temple for fasting and puja.

Why is Janmashtami Celebrated?

According to Hindu religious beliefs, Lord Shri Krishna was born in Mathura during the Dwapara Yuga on the Ashtami Tithi of Krishna Paksha in the month of Bhadrapada. His parents were **Devaki and Vasudeva**.

At that time, the people of Mathura were suffering due to the tyranny of King Kansa. According to religious beliefs, Lord Vishnu incarnated as Shri Krishna to destroy evil and establish righteousness.

The life of Lord Shri Krishna teaches us the values of **dharma, karma, truth, love, and duty**. In the Bhagavad Gita, Lord Krishna explained the importance of performing one's duties and following the path of righteousness. Therefore, Janmashtami is not only a celebration of Lord Krishna's birth but also an opportunity to remember his teachings and ideals.

Religious Significance of Janmashtami

Janmashtami is considered a highly significant festival in Hinduism. On this day, devotees worship Lord Shri Krishna with faith and devotion.



The major religious significance of Janmashtami includes:

- Celebrating the birth of Lord Shri Krishna.
- Devotees observing a fast and worshipping the Lord.
- Worshipping the child form of Shri Krishna at midnight.
- Organizing bhajans, kirtans, and devotional programs at homes and temples.
- Offering Makhan-Mishri, fruits, sweets, and other prasad to Lord Krishna.
- Organizing Krishna Janmashtami tableaux and special religious programs at various places.

How to Celebrate Janmashtami 2026?

On Janmashtami, devotees traditionally wake up early in the morning, take a bath, and wear clean clothes. They then remember Lord Shri Krishna and take a vow to observe the fast.

1. Clean and Decorate Your Home

Clean the house and especially the puja area before Janmashtami. The place of worship can be decorated beautifully with flowers, lamps, and other decorative items.



2. Decorate Bal Gopal

Dress the child form of Lord Shri Krishna, commonly known as **Laddu Gopal**, in new clothes. He can be decorated with a crown, flute, flower garland, and beautiful ornaments.

3. Decorate a Jhula

There is a tradition of preparing a beautiful cradle or swing for Bal Gopal on Janmashtami. The swing can be decorated with flowers and colorful decorations.

4. Observe a Fast

Many devotees observe a fast on Janmashtami. Fasting should be done according to one's health, personal capacity, and family tradition. The rules of Janmashtami fasting may vary according to different traditions.

5. Worship Lord Shri Krishna

Lord Shri Krishna is worshipped around Nishita Kaal at night. Water, Panchamrit, flowers, fruits, Tulsi leaves, incense, lamps, and other puja items are commonly used. Devotees perform the Abhishek of Lord Krishna with Panchamrit and then dress the deity in new clothes.



6. Offer Makhan-Mishri

Makhan and Mishri are traditionally considered among Lord Krishna's favorite offerings. On Janmashtami, devotees can offer Makhan-Mishri along with fruits and other sattvic foods as prasad.

7. Celebrate Krishna's Birth at Midnight

At midnight, devotees celebrate the birth of Lord Shri Krishna by blowing conch shells and ringing bells. After the birth celebration, devotees perform aarti and distribute prasad among family members and other devotees.

Janmashtami Puja Samagri

The following items are generally required for performing Janmashtami puja at home:

- Idol of Lord Shri Krishna or Laddu Gopal
- New clothes and crown
- Cradle or swing
- Panchamrit
- Milk, curd, and ghee
- Honey and Gangajal
- Makhan-Mishri



- Tulsi leaves
- Fruits and sweets
- Flowers and garlands
- Incense sticks and lamp
- Roli and Akshat
- Puja thali

The list of puja items may vary according to regional customs and family traditions.

Dahi Handi Celebration on Janmashtami

On the day after Janmashtami, **Dahi Handi** celebrations are organized in many places. A pot filled with curd or other items is hung at a height, and groups of young people form human pyramids to break the pot.

This tradition is associated with the childhood activities of Lord Krishna and his love for butter. In 2026, Dahi Handi will be celebrated on **September 5**.

Janmashtami in Mathura and Vrindavan

On the occasion of Janmashtami, **Mathura and Vrindavan** host special religious celebrations.





Temples are beautifully decorated, and a large number of devotees visit these holy places to seek the blessings of Lord Shri Krishna.

Bhajans, kirtans, tableaux, Abhishek ceremonies, and the midnight birth celebration are among the major attractions of the festival.

What Message Does Janmashtami Give Us?

The life of Shri Krishna teaches us many important lessons. Lord Krishna taught that a person should perform their duties sincerely without being overly concerned about the results.

Janmashtami inspires us to **follow the path of righteousness, stand against injustice, practice love and compassion, and fulfill our responsibilities with honesty and dedication.**

Shri Krishna Janmashtami 2026 will be celebrated with devotion and faith on Friday, September 4. The festival is not only a celebration of the birth of Lord Shri Krishna but also an opportunity to follow his teachings and ideals in our daily lives.
